3. Executive elections

4. <u>Presentation:</u> Dr Richard Yeo, Australian Road Research Board, spoke on the work of the ARRB, in particular addressing the next generation or transport infrastructure for an intelligent mobility future. ARRB is a research organisation funded by Austroads.

Rapidly changing technology and how cities operate is laying the groundwork for an 'infrastructure re-set'. Some of the underlying factors are

- Mobility as a service
- Connected and automated
- Shared spaces
- Innovative vehicles
- Last mile mobility
- Safety
- Sustainability
- New economy

New technology will bring about change and cities need to prepare for different vehicle types, different ways of travel requiring different infrastructure. People becoming less concerned with how they travel.

ARRB is organised into 6 strategic sections

- Future transport infrastructure
- Future transport systems
- Transport safety
- Sustainability and resilience
- Asset management
- Data collection and analysis

ARRB now in its 60th year, and has recently moved to the National Transport Research Centre in Port Melbourne.

Richard provided a sample of the work of each section

Future transport infrastructure

Research labororatories enabling full scale pavement performance testing using an accelerated loading facility. This enables cost-effective all-weather roads with improved durability, optimal resource use and life cycle costing

Future Transport Systems

- Smart traffic management
- Network operations planning
- Intelligent transport systems assets
- Advanced mobility technologies

This section covers a lot of the issues around road and infrastructure design for the new technologies, and readiness for connected and automated vehicles.

Transport safety

- Transport safety policy
- Transport user behaviour
- Safe road infrastructure
- Safe mobility

Richard noted the long-term reducing road toll, but there are some failures in the current system in the field, and a transformative approach to road safety needed.

A new national road safety strategy will address this. Vision 0 by 2050 is well achievable, in fact can be bettered.

Sustainability and Resilience

- Resilient transport systems
- Sustainable transport planning
- Freight and logistics
- Transport policy

Richard gave the example of smart materials and recycled materials in road construction and surfacing, addressing the whole of the road life cycle. ARRB is currently working on the Hume Highway in conjunction with VicRoads.

Asset management, data collection and analysis

The critical importance of good data collection and analysis to support decisions iPAVE - intelligent pavement assessment vehicle iSSAVE - intelligence safety surface assessment vehicle

Note ARRB local government guides setting out best practice for road and bridge maintenance.

Richard issued a general invitation to MTF councils to visit the ARRB laboratory in Port Melbourne for a tour and presentation.

4. Strategic Public Transport Advocacy

Greg Day, Edunity, had provided advocacy suggestions to progress the A (active), B(buses) and C(choices) priorities for the MTF for 2020.

- Nominate a cycling ambassador
- Encourage member councils to include bus advocacy in meetings with state MPs
- Organise a bus forum mid 2020.

The incoming executive will review the strategy and present to the March meeting for council endorsement.

City of Kingston

7,8 level crossing removals underway

Also Mordialloc freeway under construction with significant loss of trees and native vegetation, project includes road upgrades on the major approaches.

22 hectare site in the green wedge under pressure for development, campaign to retain

City of Banyule

North East Link Environmental Effects Statement supported Banyule on 5 key points but all were rejected by the Minister.

Concerns were expressed about the design process. The reference design is approved by the EES. Some early works underway and already impacting on residents. However the final design is not committed or known until the contract is signed.

City of Brimbank

Expecting the business case for airport rail soon

City of Casey

Paul Hamilton spoke of the value of the MTF as adds value to both officers and councillors. Over time the MTF has extended its focus from inner to all metropolitan councils. However it can be difficult to find consensus with a broad membership. By maintaining a bipartisan, non-adversarial and facilitative approach, the MTF has developed valuable links to upper levels of state government, both the bureaucracy and political, enabling good speakers and relationships. The bus forums have also provided value, and Paul encouraged councils to maintain membership.
